Small investment, big return


When he finished speaking, he said to Simon, 'Push the boat out further to the deep water, and you and your partners let down your nets for a catch.'

'Master,' Simon answered, 'we worked hard all night long and caught nothing. But if you say so, I will let down the nets.' They let them down and caught such a large number of fish that the nets were about to break. (verses 4-6)

In Luke's gospel this incident happened after Jesus had healed Simon's mother-in-law, and it was the occasion when Jesus called Simon (Peter) to follow him and 'catch people'. Peter's brash, down-to-earth approach is well known to us, so for him to respond to Jesus' idea of throwing the nets in again after a futile night's work was rather surprising. But Jesus said so, and Peter acted quickly - he already had reason to believe that obedience to Jesus was the right way to go! The results speak for themselves. More fish than Peter had ever dreamed of. No time to argue, debate, disagree - so much work to do that recruits had to be called for.

Do you sometimes marvel at how much Jesus' word produces in spite of so little faith on your part? You need never be afraid to speak up for him, or to obey him out of love for him, because you may get to see some surprising results sometimes. His ability to make things happen is beyond question.

Lord Jesus, help me to obey you, even when it seems pointless. Let me surrender myself completely – body, mind and soul- so that you may be glorified. Help me to 'dig deeper' into your word and spend more time discovering your will for me. Amen.

Reading Tips

Reading can boost a child's IQ. After looking at eight different studies of childhood development; researchers recently concluded that 'reading to a child in an interactive style raises his or her IQ by over 6 points.' The findings were revealed in Perspectives on Psychological Science, in an article entitled ' How to Make a Young Child Smarter.: Evidence From the Database of Raising Intelligence.' The research paper states, 'The following three interventions (non-dietary) were highlighted for raising the intelligence of young children: enrolling children in intense early childhood educational programs, reading to children in an interactive manner (was concluded to raise the IQ by over 3 points—the earlier the interactive reading takes place, the larger the benefits), and sending young children to preschool. Volunteering at NLS

For all parents wishing to volunteer at school to help in the classroom, on camps or with other student activities this year, parents must bring the following to the front office: 1) a current Working with Children Check and; 2) a certificate of completion of one-hour Valuing Safe Community training session on-line within the past three years. As a school of the Lutheran Church of Australia (LCA), staff and volunteers are obliged to meet the requirements of the LCA Safe Place Policy. Valuing Safe Communities (VSC) is a program to comply with this expectation. This training is valid for three years.

VSC Online Training Instructions

Go to http://ilearn.alc.edu.au/course/view.php?id=170. Follow the instructions. Use the Enrolment Key: VSC3_Volunt33r to gain access to the training. On-line training takes about 30-40 minutes. Certificates of completion will be generated at the end of the session. If you need any assistance, or would like to use a school computer to complete the training, please see Brittany at the front office.

<u>CSEF</u>

If you hold a current Health Care or Pension Card (valid on or before 29th January 2018), or are a Foster Parent, you may be eligible for a government payment under the Camps, Sports & Excursions Fund. 
