We have had a very busy week this week with many exciting opportunities to learn. On Monday, we had a performance from Regional Arts Victoria called, 'Balance'. The performance got children engaged in the exploration of sustainability, recycling and alternative power generation. Through the use of puppetry, electronics, animation and live theatre, students had a chance to step up and save the world!

On Wednesday the students had an exciting time at the Wimmera Field Days in Horsham. Students participated in many activities and performances including the Live Snake Show, Motocross stunt show and George the Farmer concert. There was so much to see, including many impressive displays and big machines! Other interesting things the children got to see was an optic fibre cable, how much sugar is in soft drink, how to save water and ways to stay safe on the farm. It was great to see students being willing to ask questions and find out information from stall holders. # **Devotional Thought**

#### From the heart

'A healthy tree does not bear bad fruit, nor does a poor tree bear good fruit. Every tree is known by the fruit it bears — you do not pick figs from thornbushes or gather grapes from bramble bushes. A good person brings good out of the treasure of good things in his heart; a bad person brings bad out of his treasure of bad things. For the mouth speaks what the heart is full of.' (verses 43-45)

Jesus' story about the tree and its fruit points to an obvious outcome at harvest time. The kind of tree determines the kind of fruit it will produce, and the health of the tree determines whether the fruit will be good or bad. This seems obvious.

But this lesson is not always so obvious when it comes to your life. Are you looking around for solutions to problems in your life? Are you wondering why your life seems to produce more dry prickles than sweet juicy grapes? Has your heart been in your mouth because of fear and worry?

God is at work in your life to enable you to bear good fruit. Like a sickly tree transplanted into good soil, your heart has been transplanted firmly into Jesus and his word. This happened first in your baptism, and now God keeps renewing you every day. God creates in you a new heart, one you can 'wear on your sleeve' in contentment, joy and peace. From this treasure of good things in your heart, will come good words and actions that will be beneficial to those around you.

Lord, help me to keep drawing nourishment from you, so that I can produce good fruit in my life. Amen.

#### First Aid Incursion

St John Ambulance will visit our school next Wednesday, the 14<sup>th</sup> of March to deliver free First Aid training to our students. Through the First Aid in Schools program, trained St John presenters lead students through tailored sessions on the importance of First Aid and what to do in the event of an emergency. Our junior students learn about how to identify when there is an emergency, keeping themselves safe, and how to call for an ambulance. Senior students learn about delivering CPR (cardiopulmonary resuscitation) and the things they can do to assist in an emergency.

#### **Volunteering at NLS**

For all parents wishing to volunteer at school to help in the classroom, on camps or with other student activities this year, parents must bring the following to the front office: 1) a current Working with Children Check and; 2) a certificate of completion of one-hour Valuing Safe Community training session on-line within the past three years. As a school of the Lutheran Church of Australia (LCA), staff and volunteers are obliged to meet the requirements of the LCA Safe Place Policy. Valuing Safe Communities (VSC) is a program to comply with this expectation. This training is valid for three years.

#### **VSC Online Training Instructions**

Go to http://ilearn.alc.edu.au/course/view.php?id=170. Follow the instructions. Use the Enrolment Key: VSC3\_Volunt33r to gain access to the training. On-line training takes about 30-40 minutes. Certificates of completion will be generated at the end of the session. If you need any assistance, or would like to use a school computer to complete the training, please see Brittany at the front office.

#### **CSEF**

If you hold a current Health Care or Pension Card (valid on or before 29<sup>th</sup> January 2018), or are a Foster Parent, you may be eligible for a government payment under the Camps, Sports & Excursions Fund. Payments are \$125 per primary student. For more information, see the attached document or visit the CSEF website. Forms have been sent home, but please enquire at the front office if you require another one. Applications should be returned to the office as soon as possible.
