God first - Acts 19:21-41

So he called them all together with others whose work was like theirs and said to them, 'Men, you know that our prosperity comes from this work. Now, you can see and hear for yourselves what this fellow Paul is doing. He says that handmade gods are not gods at all, and he has succeeded in convincing many people, both here in Ephesus and in nearly the whole province of Asia.' (verses 25,26) (read Acts 19:21-41)

Demetrius, whom we hear about in today's reading, is a very upset man. His blood pressure's rising as he sees things only going from bad to worse as this man Paul is allowed to keep spreading his message.

Poor Demetrius. He's got it all so wrong. If he'd only believed God's offer to him of salvation through Jesus, he'd have known a joy and freedom he'd never had before. And, in this new life, God would no doubt have led him to some new way of making a living.

Maybe there are times when we, like Demetrius, don't want the Christian life, and all its implications for our lives, interfering in what we see as the really important things in life, like work, family, rest and recreation.


Perhaps we need to be reminded every now and then that, when God is number one in our life, the resulting freedom and joy will actually enhance all other aspects of our life.
