### **Devotional Thought**



Chinese artist Liu Bolin's work is absolutely incredible. <u>He</u> is the artwork. He spends about 10 hours being painted for each work so that he blends into the background, like a human chameleon. Just Google Liu Bolin and check it out for yourself!

Bolin doesn't change as a person—he is still the same human Liu Bolin—but his *appearance* changes for a period of time.

This Sunday in church the focus is on Jesus' transfiguration—Luke 9 tells how Jesus took three of his disciples up a 'high mountain' and in a dazzling visual display the appearance of Jesus' face changed, and his clothes became as bright as a flash of lightning. Just like Bolin, Jesus' *being* didn't change (he has always been true God) but for a fleeting glimpse to his disciples, his appearance did. Unlike Bolin who plays art 'hide and seek' Jesus openly showed that he is truly God in human flesh.

This revelation was to comfort his disciples. Eight days before Jesus had told them of his coming crucifixion: "The Son of Man must suffer many things and be rejected by the elders, chief priests and teachers of the law, and he must be killed and on the third day be raised to life" (Luke 9:22). The disciples were confused. Here was their promised Saviour—yet he was talking about being handed over and put to death! That's hardly victory! So Jesus gives a fleeting revelation of his divine glory to assure them that even though he would be handed over to suffer and die, this was no failure, but the very way he would conquer sin, death and the devil. Truly God, Jesus rose again to win new and eternal life for all people.

Jesus' transfiguration brings assurance for us too. Even though Jesus needed to suffer and die to pay the price of the sins of the world, he will return in glory and his chosen people will share in it...not for a fleeting glimpse, but for all eternity. Indeed, whoever trusts in Jesus already shares in his eternal victory. May the account of Jesus' transfiguration fill you with hope and peace as we journey to the Cross and beyond in the coming Easter season.

### Seesaw App

This year we have decided that instead of digital portfolios we will be using an app called Seesaw. The app enables



parents to see their child's work on their iPhone, iPad, tablet and computer and provide feedback. We found last year that it helped improve students time usage, and parents enjoyed the fact that work was shared several times a week, if not daily. It gives the parents more opportunity to monitor their child's work and raise any concerns as they arise rather than waiting until the end of the semester. QR codes will be sent home to parents from their child/rens teachers. Parents who were set up last year just need to sign in, add the child and then scan the code. If you didn't have the app please make sure when you download the app that it is the parent version and follow the prompts. If you have any issues please contact Miss Keller at the front office.



Buses

Just a reminder that if your child is a bus traveller and you don't want him or her to go home on the bus on a particular afternoon, you MUST notify the school before 3pm. The school can be notified via TIQBIZ, a note in student's diary, by person or via a telephone call. The word of a student will not be accepted. Please be aware that if we are not notified, it is our responsibility to send the child on the bus.

### **Bus Passes**

If your child is required to travel on the bus and is not normally a bus traveller, or is travelling on a different bus than usual, you **must** call the school before 3pm for a bus pass. We will need to know what bus they are travelling on, what days they will be on the bus, and where they will be getting off. If we are not informed by a parent normal circumstances will apply.

### **Sports Uniform**

As mentioned earlier in the newsletter, classes have set days for Physical Education. On the day that your child as P.E. they are
