Devotional Thought

PUSH TO THE FINISH

After seeing a disabled child watching a marathon from the sidelines in his wheelchair, Andrew McMahon wanted to help children with disabilities experience the thrill of being able to participate in races. So a few years ago he founded the 'Push to the finish' organisation in America. Experienced marathon runners like Charles Stoddard volunteer to be the children's legs as they push them in jogging strollers at various events. The children are the registered participants, wear the bib numbers and take home the medals, while the runners race anonymously. 'Push to the Finish' has helped more than 75 children cross the finish line at 42 races. Many of the children are unable to speak, but most grin excitedly as they take off and a few shout: "Faster! Go faster!" Charles explains: "When we pass each other, we cheer on the child, not each other."

Sunday's reading from Hebrews 11:29-12:2 calls us to "run with perseverance the race marked out for us"—a metaphor for encouraging us to persevere in the Christian faith. The writer gives a list of real life men and women who God used in the past to bring about his plan of salvation—those who God rescued from slavery in Egypt by parting the Red Sea, those who marched around Jericho and on the seventh day gave a loud shout and the walls fell, thereby entering the land God had promised to them and other key people instrumental throughout the Old Testament including Gideon, Barak, Samson, Jephthah, David, Samuel and the prophets. They are pictured as a crowd of spectators cheering us on: "...since we are surrounded by such a great cloud of witnesses" the writer to the Hebrews says, let us throw off everything that hinders and the sin that so easily entangles, and let us run with perseverance the race marked out for us. Let us fix our eyes on Jesus, the author and perfecter of our faith."

The people mentioned in this list were ordinary everyday people with the same struggles that we have. The Israelites who were rescued through the Red Sea grumbled against Moses and Aaron, put the LORD to the test,

and when they did enter the Promised Land they broke the commandments before Moses had even come down Mount Sinai. Rahab, a prostitute, seems an unlikely candidate for a gallery of saints. King David slept with Bathsheba, then had her husband murdered. Gideon repeatedly doubted, focusing on what he couldn't see instead of God's promise.

It was God who rescued his people and stuck with them time and time again when they failed. It was God who gave strength, who was mighty in battle, who routed the enemy, who brought life from death. That's good news for us, for it is when we are weak, even unable to compete, that Jesus is like Charles Stoddard; he pushes us when we are able to compete ourselves. It is Jesus who is the author of our faith and the one who will perfect it and bring us to the end goal of our faith—life with God in heaven forever. He has already crossed the finish line for us, by living perfectly for us, completely trusting his Father's will for us, dying in our place and rising again, now seated at the right hand of God.


