Devotional Thought

Asking God for Help

If you confess that Jesus is Lord and believe that God raised him from death, you will be saved. For it is by our faith that we are put right with God; it is by our confession that we are saved. The scripture says, 'Whoever believes in him will not be disappointed.' This includes everyone, because there is no difference between Jews and Gentiles; God is the same Lord of all and richly blesses all who call to him. (verses 9-12)

Romans 10:1-13 New International Version (NIV)

10 Brothers and sisters, my heart's desire and prayer to God for the Israelites is that they may be saved. ² For I can testify about them that they are zealous for God, but their zeal is not based on knowledge. ³ Since they did not know the righteousness of God and sought to establish their own, they did not submit to God's righteousness. ⁴ Christ is the culmination of the law so that there may be righteousness for everyone who believes.

⁵ Moses writes this about the righteousness that is by the law: "The person who does these things will live by them." But the righteousness that is by faith says: "Do not say in your heart, 'Who will ascend into heaven?'"[b] (that is, to bring Christ down) 7 "or 'Who will descend into the deep?" [c] (that is, to bring Christ up from the dead).8 But what does it say? "The word is near you; it is in your mouth and in your heart," [d] that is, the message concerning faith that we proclaim: 9 If you declare with your mouth, "Jesus is Lord," and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved. ¹⁰ For it is with your heart that you believe and are justified, and it is with your mouth that you profess your faith and are saved. ¹¹ As Scripture says, "Anyone who believes in him will never be put to shame." [e] 12 For there is no difference between Jew and Gentile—the same Lord is Lord of alland richly blesses all who call on him, ¹³ for, "Everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved.

It's a bold promise that can inspire confidence in the most fearful heart: 'Everyone who calls out to the

Lord for help will be saved' (verse 13). Everyone. Not every good person. Not every righteous person. Not even every faithful person. Everyone who calls to God for help will be saved. Of course, it's possible for you to make a dangerous mistake, and that is to refuse to ask God for help. It can be tempting for you to go it alone and act as if there really are no problems or difficulties you need to be saved from. But you can be confident that God will lead you to know your need. Then, as you call out to him, he will make his grace clear to you. Listen to God's promise to you. It's stronger, clearer and more in touch with reality than any doubt or hesitation you may feel. Call out to God. He will hear you. He will save you.

Lord Jesus, you live, though once you died. Have mercy on me and save me. Amen.
