From the Principal

Congratulations to those students who represented our School and competed in the WWSSA Athletics Sports on Tuesday at Warracknabeal. This year we had 23 students make it to this next level to compete and all students achieved outstanding results. We had 5 students achieve a first placing, 8 students achieve a second and 7 students achieve a third place in their event, as well as many other great efforts. Thank you so much to all parents who went along to support and encourage the students in their events. Thank you also to Mr Pritchard for organising the students and help co-ordinate events on the day. Again, it was great to see so many of our students succeed in their athletic endeavours and also display excellent behaviour. Last week, Mrs Ann Rohde spoke to the students about Operation Christmas Child shoeboxes. Operation Christmas Child is a unique project of Samaritan's Purse bringing God's hope and joy to children in desperate situations, who have probably never received a gift before. Samaritan's Purse then arranges for these boxes to be hand-delivered to children in remote villages, slums and towns in the developing world. Last year, 342,814 shoeboxes were filled with things that light up the world of a child in poverty and sent to children in Southeast Asia and the South Pacific. This year, each class will be filling up two shoeboxes and students are encouraged to bring something to contribute to their class box. If students would like to pack their own shoebox, especially as an activity during the holidays, shoeboxes can be purchased from Rob Sherwell at Earthly treasures for \$9.50 which includes postage. If students do decide to pack their own shoebox, please make sure that the shoeboxes are back at school by Friday, 7th of October as they will be collected for delivery. Devotional Thought

Not long after we were married I was hanging some washing out when my wedding ring slipped off my finger and fell in the long grass. Not too concerned at this stage, I knelt down and started searching, assuming I would find my ring in the next few minutes. As the hours ticked by, I became increasingly anxious, because it was important to me to find my ring! *Three hours* later, parting the long grass with my hands, and with my nose to the ground, I found it. I can remember being thankful that we had an enclosed back yard—because I must have looked quite a sight with my backside in the air, nose to the ground, parting the grass with my hands, and mumbling "Help me God! Help me God!" When I found it I was so overjoyed!


We all know what it's like to lose something valuable—wallet, keys, wedding ring, money, important documents—whatever it might be, we search and search and when we find it, isn't there great joy and relief! In Sunday's gospel from Luke 15 Jesus tells a parable about searching for something lost. He says: "Suppose a women has ten silver coins and loses one. Does she not light a lamp, sweep the house and search carefully until she finds it?"

The ten coins represents this woman's life savings. One of them would be incredibly significant amount of money, one which we would all turn the house upside down to find! The woman is the central figure in the parable. She searches for the coin because it *belongs* to her, and she searches *until* it is found. This character represents Jesus. He is the Messiah who comes to seek and save the lost sheep of Israel. He is to be seen as the woman, lighting the lamp, sweeping the house carefully to make the coin tinkle on the stone floor, so that it can be heard and seen and found.

Jesus' parables use earthly realities to show us how God works in his grace. The initial audience of Jesus' parable are the Pharisees who grumble about Jesus welcoming sinners into his presence. They think that if Jesus were really God, he would not make himself ritually unclean by associating with them. But the Pharisees have not understood. Everybody needs God's grace! Those who recognise that they are unrighteous and helpless to help themselves and see their only hope in Jesus' good works are right with God. They are the ones Jesus welcomes. It has to be that way, for salvation is through faith, not by achievement. Ironically it is the Pharisees who are lost for they trust in their own works to earn God's forgiveness and favour, instead of realising that Jesus has already done that for the whole world.

The woman in the parable is a picture of how God seeks us out. God went to much greater lengths than we do when we lose something precious. He sought us out when he came down to earth in the person of Jesus, who lived perfectly for us and gave his own life on the cross. Where are you in the 'lost and found' department? Jesus concludes his parable with the promise: "And when [the woman finds the lost coin], she calls her friends and neighbours together and says, 'Rejoice with me; I have found my lost coin.' In the same way, I tell you, there is rejoicing in the presence of the angels of God over one sinner who repents."


