#### From the Principal



Nhill Lutheran School offers a range of bursaries each year to assist families in meeting their educational expenses. The form which outlines the procedures to follow has been sent to every school family. Please ensure that the form is returned by Friday, 1<sup>st</sup> of December. All requests are treated as confidential and will be left to the discretion of the Principal. In 2018, there are 3 bursaries provided by the Nhill Guild to the value of \$200 each, and 2 bursaries provided by Christine Cramer to the value of \$100 each. Families will be notified at the start of the year if they have been successful in securing a bursary. We realise that financial situations do change and fluctuate and therefore, bursaries are reviewed and offered on an annual basis. On Monday, we were blessed to have Mrs Htoo Ku Hsar Say from the International Karen Organisation visit our school. Mrs Htoo oversees the Karen migrant program and delayed her return to Europe so she could make a special trip to our school. We learnt that despite the many countries she has visited, we are the first school to have all students learn Karen and integrate it as part of our curriculum including the core value of service. She was humbled with our efforts in supporting the Maw Per Koh school and encouraged to hear our stories of how we are learning the language, singing songs and writing books to share with others.

Our class structures and staffing for next year have been finalised. I am thrilled to announce that we will have Miss Isabelle Shelton and Miss Gorgia Sealey join our staff team. Both Isabelle and Gorgia are so excited about joining our school community and we wish them every blessing as they prepare to move to Nhill. #### **Devotional Thought**

#### <u>Silence</u>

At three o'clock Jesus cried out with a loud shout, 'Eloi Eloi Iema sabachthani?' which means, 'My God, my God, why did you abandon me?'

Some of the people there heard him and said 'Listen he is calling for Elijah!' One of them ran up with a sponge, soaked it in cheap wine, and put it on the end of a stick. Then he held it up to Jesus' lips and said, 'Wait! Let us see if Elijah is coming to bring him down from the cross!'

With a loud cry Jesus died. (verses 34-37)

<sup>33</sup> When it was noon, darkness came over the whole land until three in the afternoon. <sup>34</sup> At three o'clock Jesus cried out with a loud voice, "Eloi, Eloi, lema sabachthani?" which means, "My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?" <sup>35</sup> When some of the bystanders heard it, they said, "Listen, he is calling for Elijah." <sup>36</sup> And someone ran, filled a sponge with sour wine, put it on a stick, and gave it to him to drink, saying, "Wait, let us see whether Elijah will come to take him down." <sup>37</sup> Then Jesus gave a loud cry and breathed his last. <sup>38</sup> And the curtain of the temple was torn in two, from top to bottom. <sup>39</sup> Now when the centurion, who stood facing him, saw that in this way he breathed his last, he said, "Truly this man was God's Son!"

In the gospel account that Mark gives us, Jesus said only one thing on the cross, just before he died. For six hours he was silent. Then he cried out his terrible question. It's the opening phrase of one of the great songs of the Old Testament, Psalm 22.

Then silence – from Jesus, from God.

Yes, there are many explanations of this death in the letters Paul wrote and in the other New Testament books: redemption, forgiveness, atonement. The very existence of the gospels, the church, the Christian community, revolves completely around this scene. Which still doesn't explain Jesus' cry of 'My God, my God, why did you abandon me?' Such a heart-rending cry of intense loneliness! Does it mean that God's love is so intense, God's desire to restore our broken world is so fierce, that wherever we are, in whatever dark place, God is still nearby? I believe that's how it is.

Dear God, when I feel lost and totally alone, touch me with your love, remind me with your voice that you will never abandon me. Amen.

#### Volunteering at NLS

As a school of the Lutheran Church of Australia (LCA), staff and volunteers are obliged to meet the requirements of the LCA Safe Place Policy. Valuing Safe Communities (VSC) is a program to comply with this expectation. This training is valid for three years.

#### Scholarships

The Nhill Lutheran Parents and Friends Association will be offering two scholarships in 2018 that will be determined by the staff. Students do not have to register their interest in the Academic Scholarships as all students will be eligible for consideration. The scholarships will apply to students who demonstrate excellence in academics, display excellent attitude and behaviour, and consistently strive for a high standard of work. Both of these scholarships are to the value of \$300 each and recipients will be announced at the end of year Graduation Service.

#### **Bursaries**

Fee assistance is available to current Nhill Lutheran families who may be experiencing financial hardship. Families requiring assistance are asked to complete the fee assistance form which outlines the procedures to follow in order to request assistance.
