## From the Principal

In preparation for Easter, all students made pancakes on Tuesday. Students worked together in small groups to read a recipe and make sure that just the right amounts of flour, eggs and milk were used to make delicious pancakes.

Students learnt that historically Shrove Tuesday was when households would use up all food that wasn't eaten during Lent, which was a period of fasting. On Wednesday, we had an Ash Wednesday Chapel to mark the beginning of the season of Lent. Students had the opportunity to receive a sign of the cross after the service as a personal reminder of what Jesus did for us by going to the cross. We also learnt that the good news story doesn't stop at the cross. Because Jesus rose again, he beat death and we can live with him forever.

Our students continue to enjoy their swimming lessons and learn important water skills. We are very grateful to Alaine McFarlane for her expertise in teaching our students again this year. Alaine is a highly qualified swimming instructor and has an excellent repertoire with the students. # **The Repair Shop**

Anyone who is joined to Christ is a new being; the old is gone, the new has come. All this is done by God, who through Christ changed us from enemies into his friends and gave us the task of making others his friends also. Our message is that God was making all human beings his friends through Christ. God did not keep an account of their sins, and he has given us the message which tells how he makes them his friends. (2 Corinthians 5: 17-19)

In the middle of the shopping mall was a small booth. Across the top were the words 'The Repair Shop'. Inside, a repairman worked at a counter. He seemed to specialise in electrical goods. People brought their broken appliances, ones with faulty connections, and he restored them to working order.

A similar name could be applied to a local church. Churches are like repair shops. They are places where broken people can come to be repaired. Their major problem is that they have faulty connections. They are not plugged into God properly, and this causes them to have fractured relationships with other people.

When you belong to a church, it's because you have personally experienced a repaired relationship with God, and this has made it possible for you to reconnect in positive ways to others. Your main job now is to help others experience restored relationships, first with God and then with other people.

Lord, thank you for repairing my relationship with you and showing me how to relate to others. Help me to be a repairer myself, helping to do the same for others.

#### **Reading Buddies Program**

We are currently seeking some parent helpers to assist with our reading buddies program and



Perceptual Motor Program (PMP). Reading buddies involves parent volunteers coming into classrooms and listening to students reading aloud. Volunteers must have a current Working With Children Check and complete the training that is explained below.

#### **Volunteering at NLS**

For all parents wishing to volunteer at school to help in the classroom, on camps or with other student activities this year, parents must bring the following to the front office: 1) a current Working with Children Check and; 2) a certificate of completion of one-hour Valuing Safe Community training session on-line within the past three years. As a school of the Lutheran Church of Australia (LCA), staff and volunteers are obliged to meet the requirements of the LCA Safe Place Policy. Valuing Safe Communities (VSC) is a program to comply with this expectation. This training is valid for three years.

#### **VSC Online Training Instructions**

Go to http://ilearn.alc.edu.au/course/view.php?id=170. Follow the instructions. Use the Enrolment Key: VSC3\_Volunt33r to gain access to the training. On-line training takes about 30-40 minutes. Certificates of completion will be generated at the end of the session. If you need any assistance, or would like to use a school computer to complete the training, please see Brittany at the front office.

### QUALITY SCHOOLS SURVEYS 2018

This year our school will be participating in surveys managed by Research Australia Development and Innovation Institute (RADII). The surveys are being conducted for the school by RADII under a contract with Lutheran Education Australia.

All survey responses go directly to RADII and are not identifiable by the school, unless you wish to indicate that you want your feedback to be identified. All data will be stored securely and the anonymity of all participants is assured.

If you do not to participate in the survey or you do not want your child to participate, please notify the school.

We encourage you to respond to the survey as this provides valuable feedback to the school. When the feedback from the survey is received we will share the findings with you.
