Thank you to the P&F for providing such a fun movie night for all students last Friday. It was terrific to see

so many enjoy a great night. This week, our Year 3 and 4 students have been away on a marine camp at Portland. Activities have included a boat ride with Portland Harbour Tours, beach treasure hunting, fossil education, fishing, Indigenous education at Tower Hill, Flagstaff Hill at Warrnambool, the Shipwreck sound and light show, Portland cable tram, Water tower museum, Maritime museum and other various activities including a night camp fire and astronomy. We look forward to hearing more about camp when they arrive back to school.

Next Monday 7 May, students in Years 3-6 will be participating in the Cross Country at the Nhill College beginning at 10.15am. Parents are welcome to come along and encourage the students. Students are required to wear their sports uniform.

The National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) for Years 3 and 5 students, are scheduled for Tuesday 15 May (Language Conventions and Writing), Wednesday 16 May (Reading) and Thursday 17 May (Numeracy). These tests are one part of a wide assessment regime that we use to look at what level students are achieving in Literacy and Numeracy against National Standards. Later in the year we will send parents an individual student NAPLAN report that can be used to view and monitor progress. It is important to know that NAPLAN is not a pass/fail test. It simply looks at what level students are achieving in Literacy and Numeracy against National Standards and is just one part of our assessment program. A letter explaining NAPLAN in more detail has been sent home to every student in Years 3 and 5.

On Friday, 11 May, our students will be presenting a special Chapel with a Mother's Day focus. A special morning tea will be provided afterwards and we encourage all mothers to attend.

'As a result the master of

this dishonest manager praised him for doing such a shrewd thing; because the people of this world are much more shrewd in handling their affairs than the people who belong to the light.'

And Jesus went on to say, 'And so I tell you: make friends for yourselves with worldly wealth, so that when it gives out, you will be welcomed in the eternal home.' (verses 8,9)

Christians have often been accused—probably accurately—of having a very unrealistic view of life in this world. That's a little strange, because Jesus had so much to say about how to live in this world. It's true that what he had to say about human relationships, politics and wealth flowed from his vision of God, but what he had to say was clear and down to earth.

So Jesus tells this engaging story about the crooked but shrewd manager who, faced with the sack, not strong enough for a labourer's job and too proud to beg, used his position to put himself in favour with other wealthy people, and so ensured his future.

Volunteering at NLS

For all parents wishing to volunteer at school to help in the classroom, on camps or with other student activities this year, parents must bring the following to the front office: 1) a current Working with Children Check and; 2) a certificate of completion of one-hour Valuing Safe Community training session on-line within the past three years. As a school of the Lutheran Church of Australia (LCA), staff and volunteers are obliged to meet the requirements of the LCA Safe Place Policy. Valuing Safe Communities (VSC) is a program to comply with this expectation. This training is valid for three years.

VSC Online Training Instructions

Go to http://ilearn.alc.edu.au/course/view.php? id=170. Follow the instructions. Use the Enrolment Key: VSC3_Volunt33r to gain access to the training. Online training takes about 30-40 minutes. Certificates of completion will be generated at the end of the session. If you need any assistance, or would like to use a school computer to complete the training, please see Brittany at the front office.

Conveyance Allowance

In some locations in rural and regional Victoria, eligible parents/carers are able to access the conveyance allowance to help with the costs of student travel to and from school. An eligible student may be granted a conveyance allowance if they reside 4.8km or more from the bus stop or from our school according to Google maps.
