# **Devotional Thought**

## If only you knew...

He came closer to the city, and when he saw it, he wept over it, saying, 'If you only knew today what is needed for peace! But now you cannot see it! The time will come when your enemies will surround you with barricades, blockade you, and close in on you from every side. They will completely destroy you and the people within your walls; not a single stone will they leave in its place, because you did not recognise the time when God came to save you!' (verses 41-44)

I wonder how many times you have said, 'If only they had known'.

Perhaps the most outstanding example of that in recent times was the 11 September 2001 attack on the World Trade Centre in New York. If only people had known, thousands of lives could have been saved. On that day people went about their business with no idea of what was about to happen.

Now there is not one stone left at Ground Zero. The immediate reaction to the devastation was the so-called war on terrorism. This has not made for peace but for an escalation of hatred.

Jesus must be weeping over the world today just as he wept over Jerusalem. The world still has not learnt what is needed for peace; people still can't see it. The world does not recognise the God of peace, who has made peace and brought reconciliation for us through the death of his Son.

Philip Yancey wrote in his book *What's So Amazing about Grace?*, 'Sacrificial love is one of the most powerful weapons in the Christian's arsenal of grace'.

We need to know God's love and his forgiveness of our sins, and we need to allow ourselves to be his instrument of peace by bringing his saving message of grace and forgiveness to others.

'Lord, make me an instrument of your peace; where there is hatred, let me sow love; where there is injury, pardon . . . where there is doubt, faith'. Amen.

# **School Event News**

#### Volunteering at NLS

For all parents wishing to volunteer at school to help in the classroom, on camps or with other student activities this year, parents must bring the following to the front office: 1) a current Working with Children Check and; 2) a certificate of completion of one-hour Valuing Safe Community training session on-line within the past three years. As a school of the Lutheran Church of Australia (LCA), staff and volunteers are obliged to meet the requirements of the LCA Safe Place Policy. Valuing Safe Communities (VSC) is a program to comply with this expectation. This training is valid for three years.

#### VSC Online Training Instructions

Go to http://ilearn.alc.edu.au/course/view.php?id=170. Follow the instructions. Use the Enrolment Key: VSC3\_Volunt33r to gain access to the training. On-line training takes about 30-40 minutes. Certificates of completion will be generated at the end of the session. If you need any assistance, or would like to use a school computer to complete the training, please see Brittany at the front office.

#### **Conveyance Allowance**

In some locations in rural and regional Victoria, eligible parents/carers are able to access the conveyance allowance to help with the costs of student travel to and from school. An eligible student may be granted a conveyance allowance if they reside 4.8km or more from the bus stop or from our school according to Google maps. Families can contact Miss Keller at the front office for an application form or for more information.

As a parent, feeling confident in the safety of your child or children at the school they attend is extremely important. Some of the questions parents have about school safety may be:

- How are lockdown drills implemented?
- What plans are in place to help kids stay safe?

• How can I talk to my child or respond to their questions or anxiety about school safety? While "school safety" is a broad term with various applications within every school, the information in this article can help parents learn about actions schools across the country are taking to make themselves safer and better prepared for an emergency. At Nhill Lutheran School we regularly practice all different drills so students can become familiar with what to do in emergency situations and remain calm. All staff are highly trained and are familiar with the procedures in place. We also like to ensure all visitors are kept safe and have various policies and procedures in place to ensure this occurs. We feel feedback regarding these policies and procedures is an important factor in everyone feeling safe.
