Kindness

Kindness is a wonderful quality to possess and to share. Kindness breeds kindness. Kindness is goodness in action, sweetness of disposition, gentleness in dealing with others, benevolence, kindness, affability (I found that on Wikipedia!). Notice it says that kindness is goodness **in action** – it's a verb, a doing word. Kindness is also a Fruit of the Spirit mentioned in the book of Galatians. Students at our school demonstrate kindness through the use of kind words that build up and encourage, and kind actions that help others without expecting something in return. Kind communities help develop and grow a caring culture, promote inclusion and reduce unkind behaviours. This term we have started focusing on the characteristic of kindness and will be acknowledging acts of kindness at assemblies. If you notice anyone from our school community being (or doing) kind, then let us know.

What sort of learner is your child?

All children learn differently. There's not a one size fits all approach to educating students, and flexibility is needed to cater for different student needs. We are blessed at Nhill Lutheran School to have staff who go beyond to cater for the needs of their students – your children. We want the students to be deep thinkers, resilient, and able to face learning challenges with persistence. An important influence in helping student achievement is a positive home-school relationship, and we welcome opportunities to collaborate with parents/caregivers.

The Miracles of Jesus

The chapel focus for this term is The Miracles of Jesus. Last Friday Pastor Carl shared the story of Jesus' first miracle where he turned water into wine. When exploring these stories it's important to ask questions such as "how did Jesus do the miracle?", "why did Jesus do the miracle?", "who benefited from the miracle?", "what can we learn from the miracle story?".

Thank you to all families who attended the Welcome BBQ last Friday. It was great to see you there and hope that you were able to build connections with others in our school community. A special thank you to the P&F and their helpers who organised the evening.

Rubber boots

A reminder that students may have rubber boots to wear when they play outside when it is wet, and especially if they wish to play in our fantastic water feature. Thank you to Ken Voigt who has built another boot rack for students to store their boots.

Drop off and Pick up

Many schools face challenges at drop off and pick up times and it is important we make these times as safe as possible. Currently we have a busy front driveway at the school. When the bus arrives in the afternoon a rope with a coloured flag is attached to the front gate to prevent vehicles from entering the driveway behind the bus. This is a safety measure to prevent vehicles from reversing out of the driveway onto Mackay Street when families with children are present. Thank you for being safe at these times. We are currently exploring alternatives to the bus drop off and pick up.

The next few weeks provide a variety of learning opportunities for our students. We have our swimming lessons and swimming carnival, an excursion to the Starlab, and an excursion to the Wimmera Field Days. We are grateful for these opportunities and hope positive learning and growth will happen for our students.

Reading Buddies Program

We are currently seeking some parent helpers to assist with our reading buddies program and Perceptual Motor Program (PMP). Reading buddies involves parent volunteers coming into classrooms and listening to students reading aloud. Volunteers must have a current Working With Children Check and complete the training that is explained below.

Volunteering at NLS

For all parents wishing to volunteer at school to help in the classroom, on camps or with other student activities this year, parents must bring the following to the front office: 1) a current Working with Children Check and; 2) a certificate of completion of one-hour Valuing Safe Community training session on-line within the past three years. As a school of the Lutheran Church of Australia (LCA), staff and volunteers are obliged to meet the requirements of the LCA Safe Place Policy. Valuing Safe Communities (VSC) is a program to comply with this expectation. This training is valid for three years.

VSC Online Training Instructions

Go to http://ilearn.alc.edu.au/course/ view.php?id=170. Follow the instructions. Use the Enrolment Key: VSC4_Volunt33r to gain access to the training. On-line training takes about 30-40 minutes. Certificates of completion will be generated at the end of the session. If you need any assistance, or would like to use a school computer to complete the training, please see Mrs Koning at the front office.
