Principal Appraisal

To the school community of Nhill Lutheran School,

As some of you may know, it is the policy of Lutheran Education (Victoria New South Wales and Tasmania) that when Principals take up a new position in a Lutheran school, there is an appraisal held towards the end of their first year in order to give them feedback on how they're progressing. This is an important part of their professional development. With that in mind, Lutheran Education has arranged an appraisal for our Principal, Damon Prenzler, to take place in the second week of term 4.

The purpose of an appraisal is to affirm and commend Damon on those matters that are going well, and to suggest any actions that would support him to be more effective in the position.

Principals First, which is a completely independent Christian group whose members come from the Principal class, has been engaged to look after this. I am one of that team and have been asked to undertake this appraisal. I will be having conversations with the staff, parents, and members of the School Council, as well as with the Principal himself, so that I can prepare a report and recommendations.

In next week's Newsletter, there will be more detail on how this Appraisal is conducted. I am writing this note to the school community today to give you some advance notice, especially because some of you who are parents will be chosen (at random) to take part in these interviews. Invitations to be involved in the interviews will come out at the start of term 4.

I trust you will see that this appraisal will be a valuable means of professional growth for your Principal and will do what you can, if invited, to make it a worthwhile and productive experience.

I look forward to meeting with many of you in October.


