## **Devotional Thought**

#### Who are these children?

Truly I tell you, anyone who will not receive the kingdom of God like a little child will never enter it.' And he took the children in his arms, placed his hands on them and blessed them (Mark 10:15,16).

Read Mark 10:2-16

Can you see yourself as one of these children, wrapped in Jesus' arms and receiving his blessing?

In baptism, God declares that we are his children, coheirs with Christ. In Galatians 3:26,27, we read:

So in Christ Jesus you are all children of God through faith, for all of you who were baptised into Christ have clothed yourselves with Christ.

At baptism, we are gifted with the ability to pray the Lord's Prayer and call on God as <u>our</u> 'Father'.

As such children, we can place ourselves in this image of having a close relationship with Jesus, our Saviour. This is not a remote relationship, or one held at armslength, but close, in his arms with his hands upon us, blessing us.

We also recognise from this text that we are part of a family. The plural is used. We are not an 'only child' in a relationship with a God who focuses just on us. We are part of a family. When Jesus gave us the Lord's Prayer, it begins, 'Our Father ...'. It is not about 'me' or 'my'. As the children of God, we live in community, in a family.

There is a saying, 'You can choose your friends, but you can't choose your relatives'. It is not us who choose the members of this family. God established it through Jesus; it is God who says, 'You are mine'. God claims us and places us in this family. We recognise and endorse this family as we confess our faith together in the words of the Nicene Creed: 'We believe ....'

We have been created as individuals, unique – our DNA and fingerprints are ours alone. As individuals, the Holy Spirit seeks to bring each of us to faith and into God's family, where we are united to form one body.

We give thanks that we can come to you as our Father, knowing it is your will that each of us knows you love us as your children, heirs with your Son, Jesus Christ, to eternal life through your grace. May the Holy Spirit renew and refresh our faith in you daily as we worship and serve you. In Jesus' name, Amen.





#### We are SunSmart a note for families

Too much of the sun's ultraviolet (UV) radiation can cause sunburn, skin and eye damage and skin cancer.

UV damage accumulated during childhood and adolescence is associated with an increased risk of skin cancer later in life. Skin cancer is the most common cancer in Australia. It is also one of the most preventable cancers.

You can't see or feel the sun's UV. Whatever the weather, if the UV levels are three or more, it's important to *Slip, Slop, Slap, Seek and Slide*!

#### Sun protection times

Don't just wait for hot and sunny days to use sun protection. Check the sun protection times each day so your family can be protected when they need to be.



Daily local sun protection times and weather details Daily local sun protection times and weather details are available from the SunSmart widget on our school website, in the weather section of the newspaper, on the SunSmart website at <a href="mailto:sunsmart.com.au">sunsmart.com.au</a> and as a free SunSmart app. Sun protection times can also be found at the <a href="mailto:Bureau of Meteorology website">Bureau of Meteorology website</a> and live UV levels are available from <a href="mailto:ARPANSA">ARPANSA</a>.

#### SunSmart membership

Our school is a registered member of Cancer Council Victoria's SunSmart Schools Program. We aim to protect students and staff from too much UV.

Sun protection and skin cancer prevention is a shared responsibility. Please help support our SunSmart membership and sun protection efforts by ensuring your child follows the SunSmart measures included in our policy at school and at home.

During the daily local sun protection times (usually from mid-August to the end of April), *use these* 5 SunSmart steps – even if it's cool and cloudy.

#### SLIP on covering

1. SLIP on covering clothing
For free dress days, ensure your child wears clothing that covers as much skin as possible (e.g. elbow length tops with a higher neckline or collar and longer style shorts or skirts). Densely woven fabrics are best.



#### 2. SLOP on SPF50+ broad-spectrum, water-

2. SLOP on SPF50+ broad-spectrum, waterresistant sunscreen
Apply a generous amount of sunscreen at the start of
the day and make sure children have sunscreen in
their bag ready to reapply throughout the day.
Sunscreen should be reapplied every two hours.
Please ensure children get plenty of sunscreen
application practice at home so they'll be all set when
they are at school. Under supervision, ask children to
put a dot of sunscreen on each cheek, nose and chin
and rub it in (avoiding the eye area) and sunscreen
squiggles or dots on the back of the neck, arms and
legs to cover these areas.

#### 3. SLAP on a hat that protects the face, neck

3. SLAP on a hat that protects the face, neck and ears
Choose a wide-brimmed, legionnaire or bucket hat.
Peak caps and visors do not offer enough UV protection so please leave them at home. Please help your child remember to bring and wear their approved school hat. Please keep this at school so they will always be ready for outdoor activities, outdoor learning and play during school days. For the walk to and from school and weekends, please have an extra home hat to help keep children protected at home.

SEEK shade
 Choose shady spots for learning and play whenever possible.

## **5. SLIDE** on wrap-around **AS1067** sunglasses When appropriate and practical, help protect the eyes with sunglasses.










## Nhill Show Day Parade & Kid's Shearing Fun


The students are making some very basic hats for the day that they can wear in the parade behind the school flag as a group. No uniform is necessary. The hats will be available at the line up stage from a staff member.
